



It is the world's first tea factory and was established in 1859. **Makaibari** follows a form of integrated forest management called permaculture where the tea bush is part of a multi-tier system of trees and plants typical of a sub-tropical rainforest, as opposed to a monoculture-a farm that grows only one crop. Makaibari retains 70% of its entire area under forest cover.

This is the oldest and the most talked about tea estate in Darjeeling district which is still run by the descendants of Banerjee family who were the original founders of the estate. Located in Kurseong and covering a gross area of 750 hectars, Makaibari has gone on to win many accolades in the world tea platform.
